**CONSULTATION ON THE INTENTION TO REPEAL THE REGULATIONS REGARDING FUEL BURNING APPLIANCES IN DWELLING HOUSES MADE IN TERMS OF SECTION 44(1)(dA) OF THE ATMOSPHERIC POLLUTION PREVENTION ACT, 1965**
