**NATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT: PROTECTED AREAS ACT, 2003
(ACT NO. 57 OF 2003)**

**CONSULTATION ON THE INTENTION TO DECLARE LAND SITUATED IN THE NORTHERN CAPE
PROVINCE SPECIFIED IN THE NOTICE AS PART OF THE EXISTING AUGRABIES NATIONAL
PARK**

I, Barbara Dallas Creecy, Minister of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment, hereby under section 20(1)(a)(ii), read with sections 31 and 33, of the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act No.57 of 2003), consult on my intention to declare certain land situated in the Northern Cape Province, as set out in the Schedule hereto, as part of the existing Augrabies National Park.

South African National Parks (SANParks) is working towards consolidating the protected areas network to become one economic unit. SANParks acquired the properties, listed in the Schedule to the Government Notice, for inclusion into the existing Augrabies National Park.

Members of the public are invited to submit to the Minister, within sixty (60) days from the date of the publication of the notice in the *Gazette*, written representations on or objections to this notice to any of the following addresses:
